## SAVING THE WORLD (FOR REAL)

Climate change has moved from the front pages to the latest blockbusters, says **Al Horner** 

n Eternals, the latest Marvel Cinematic Universe epic, a band of heroes steps up to save a world on the brink of environmental disaster. What's unique about that, you might ask? There's no shortage of examples of past blockbusters using eco-collapse as a backdrop for thrilling spectacles, after all. In Mad Max: Fury Road all that remains of the Earth are scorched sands and a grizzled Tom Hardy. The Day After Tomorrow, meanwhile, presages the coming of a second Ice Age. From WALL-E to Waterworld - aka That 90s Movie Where Kevin Costner Plays a Ponytailed Fish-Person - Hollywood has been imagining uninhabitable versions of our planet for decades now. So what makes Eternals stand apart?

Well, for a start, it's an eco-related blockbuster released in a time where environmental disaster feels less like fiction and more like our fate, if drastic action isn't taken soon. It's part of a new wave of climate change-themed blockbusters that seeks to grapple with the issue. At the end of last year, Adam McKay's star-studded Don't Look Up used a comet on a collision course with Earth as a metaphor for our own looming crisis. Two of the blockbusters set to compete for 2022's highest-grossing movie - Jurassic World: Dominion and James Cameron's long-awaited Avatar 2 - meanwhile, are both expected to address climate concerns, having touched on humanity's fragile relationship with nature in previous instalments.




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Time and, more recently, the 26-year-old stood out in director Philip Barantini's second feature *Boiling Point*, which was filmed in a single take in a busy east London kitchen.

#### How did filming *Boiling Point* in one take affect your experience on set?

It was like working in theatre. You have to roll with whatever happens – you can't stop and start again. You don't get much of a breather, which is a metaphor for what it's like to be in one of those high-stakes kitchens, and it's a stressful movie to watch for that reason. About 80% of the dialogue was completely improvised. We had a microscript, and we knew which beats we had to hit and approximately how much time we had. It was incredibly creative. It delves into the stresses of working in hospitality, mental health, substance abuse, addiction issues. It touches on racism, classism, technology. It's a slice of life.

#### You filmed during Covid. How did that impact things on set?

I was in Serbia at the beginning of Covid, filming The Outpost, and flew back to London for Boiling Point. We boshed it out in two days, doing two takes each day. The plan had been to do this for four or five days, but Covid shut us down

or five days, but Covid shut us down after two. We were the last project still shooting in London by the time we found out that we only had just one take left. No pressure...

#### How did you all look so convincing as chefs?

We had to learn how to chop. An amazing guy called Tom Brown, who owns a restaurant in east London called Cornerstone, came and taught us the basics. Not only was he teaching us to cook, but also how to hold yourself in the kitchen, the nuances that would help the realism of the piece. How do you hold a kitchen towel? Is it tucked into

your apron or hanging over your shoulder? How do you hold the knife?

#### What did you learn to cook?

Honestly, I just learnt to julienne. I was making a green juice yesterday, which is just celery, spinach and stuff you can chuck in the blender, but I'm there going to town cutting them julienne. Whenever someone's cooking, I'm like, do you want me to cut the onions? Trust me, you want me to cut the onions.

#### Your next upcoming film is *Persuasion*. What is it about period pieces?

It's something that just happened. Growing up as a little brown Scottish girl, I didn't see myself in period dramas. So, when I got Mary Queen of Scots it was a massive shock. It wasn't something I was told I couldn't do – but I was focusing on things I thought I had more of a chance of getting. I'll take an indie any day, like Boiling Point, when you get to tell stories in a naturalistic way. But when you do periods or sci-fi fantasies, that level of dress-up and imagination? I relish that environment. Just fannying around in a massive dress and a corset, giggling away.

#### There's been a cultural shift towards actors of colour being cast in period dramas recently...

It's really cool that I am getting to tell these stories. When Jane Austen wrote *Persuasion*, and in the productions of it since, the Musgrove family certainly weren't a family of colour. Now, little

brown girls and boys can watch this and think, this is how we would have lived then, this is what we would have done with our hair. It will do a lot for these kids and, hopefully, they won't even know it. So, if I get given a period gig, I'ma take it.








WALK INTO ANY bar around the world today and you'll find shelves tightly packed with a near-endless selection of bourbons, ranging from household names to exorbitantly priced rare releases. If you thought American whiskey was always this popular, however, you'd be mistaken.

"Thirty years ago, American whiskey was in a rough state," says Chris Morris, master distiller at Woodford Reserve, America's number one super premium whiskey. "Distilleries in Kentucky were being mothballed. I think there were only nine in the state and two in Tennessee."

Woodford Reserve's journey to becoming the leading bourbon in the country was no foregone conclusion, either. It only came about because one man, Owsley Brown II of Brown-Forman, listened to his gut rather than his peers. "When Owsley



#### **MAKE THE** PERFECT OLD **FASHIONED**

#### INGREDIENTS

- 1tsp granulated sugar
- 2 dashes Angostura bitters
- 1 dash of water

and have visitors come see it, a lot of people said it wasn't a good idea. And I was one of them!" Not only that, Brown wanted his distillery to produce a product that sold at practically double the price of most bourbons and Tennessee whiskeys. Inspired by the rise in popularity of cognacs and Scottish single malts, he saw an opportunity to create American whiskey's first premium brand.

The distillery opened in Woodford County. Kentucky, and in October 1996, Woodford Reserve was born. At first, it looked like the naysayers would be proven right.

"The reception was poor to say the least." says Morris. "People would say, 'Why do we need another bourbon?'. But it was newsworthy. We had these beautiful copper pot stills and we had a bottle that looked different. So when we took it to bartenders, not only did they say it looked cool, they said it tasted great, too!"

Woodford Reserve soon began building associations with other respected names, becoming the first official bourbon of the Kentucky Derby and partnering with airlines around the world. It now sells more than a million cases a year and is the fifth largest bourbon on the planet.

Sensing that perception around American whiskey was shifting, Morris had a bright idea of his own. He decided to create the first flavour wheel for bourbons, suggesting six food pairings to bring out Woodford Reserve's subtle flavours, including cheese, toasted hazelnut and chocolate.

"There are 300 flavours in American whiskey and Woodford Reserve has 212 of them," he says. "It's the most complex bourbon, but also the most balanced. It's just sweet enough, spicy enough and fruity enough, so people taste what they want to taste. If they like sweetness, they'll get sweetness. If they like spice, they'll get spice."

Indeed, it's a taste that's perfect on the rocks or in a cocktail (it's the whiskey of choice for Old Fashioned Week and Virgin Atlantic's Clubhouse signature Manhattans). "Bartenders can make it work for anyone." That's quite the claim. We suggest you test it out.



## **APPY DAYS** IN TEL AVIV

The "Start-Up Nation" mentality has made its way into all facets of life in the city, reports local expert

n Tel Aviv, and Israel at large, referring to a "unicorn" no longer conjures up a fantastical image of a legendary creature hailing from the Middle Ages but instead a legendary start-up valued at a billion dollars hailing from the Middle East. From traffic app Waze to freelance marketplace Fiverr, the tech world has seen monumental advances coming out of Israel. The pandemic has only encouraged that: tech has made its way into food and architecture, fashion, design, and interactive apps for locals and tourists alike. With the onset of coronavirus and in its continuing aftermath, Israelis are doing what they do best: innovating. And what is the typical Tel Avivian's main priority in life? Fun.

The free **DigiTel app** keeps users up to date with everything that's going on daily in the city, from outdoor bubble parties and vintage markets to protests, open parking lots (very important!), bicycle paths, available Tel-O-Fun bicycles, and an updated directory of the hottest restaurants, parties and happenings. Via the app, beachgoers can also rent umbrellas and loungers with just a couple of swipes. >







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Tel Aviv is home to more Bauhaus and International Style buildings than anywhere else in the world, including more than 4,000 from the 1930s, and in 2003 the so-called "White City" was designated as a UNESCO World Heritage

Site. Tour the city's fascinating architectural history at the **Liebling Haus**, which showcases a slew of technological advances in the cultural space, and boasts a research lab and a comprehensive archive library with workshops for adults and kids. Download the Liebling Haus Audio app and listen to architects, historians and craftmakers narrate stories of architecture and ideology, alongside anecdotes of historical buildings and their famous residents.

The Peres Center for Peace and Innovation (1) is a museum and experience dedicated to Israeli innovation – past present and future. The

innovation – past, present and future. The impressive Hall of Inspiration offers an audiovisual presentation of Israeli inventions that have influenced the world in agriculture, medicine, cyber and tech. Touchscreens in English, Hebrew, Arabic and Chinese challenge visitors to contemplate our collective future donning VR glasses while journeying through developments in nano-robotics, autonomous transport and food technology.

Speaking of food, **Bitemojo** offers self-guided food tours with your phone leading the way, including the history of different Tel Aviv neighbourhoods and key points of interest. To dive deeper into the local culinary scene, head to **Asif: Culinary Institute of Israel (2)**, a new non-profit and resource championing Israel's diverse food cultures. The library here holds some 1,500 culinary titles, while you can also tour the gallery and rooftop farm – stopping off for a bite to eat at the cafe, or even picking up something for home at the deli.

The institute shares space with **Start-Up Nation Central**, a pioneering hub for all things innovation from Israel. When it comes to disrupting industries, as one of the top vegan-friendly countries in the world, it comes as no surprise that Israelis have been busy cultivating alternative forms of food. Book a visit to **Aleph Farms (3)**, just a short jaunt from the city, and

pick your jaw up off the floor in time to taste the future of meat. This Israeli company (backed by such stellar investors as Leonardo DiCaprio) is successfully cultivating 3D bio-printed steaks, meaning it's just a matter of time before the technology changes the face of kitchens and restaurants worldwide.

You can learn everything you need to know about the 3D-printing process at the **3D Factory**, where visitors can create

where visitors can create whatever they want in real time or even buy their very own printer to experiment with. When it comes to fashion, 3D-printed garments are the latest foray into sustainable practices. Cutting-edge brand

threeASFOUR (4) launched their spring-summer 2022 collection Kundalini, as a tech-fashion collaboration with Kornit Digital, one of the leading on-demand fashion production technological companies. The result is an explosion of unexpected colour and texture combinations using Kornit's revolutionary MAX technology, which offers never-before-seen digital decoration and design capabilities.

Tel Aviv's tech game is just getting started, and locals like to try anything and everything, so there's nowhere better to get a taste of the future.

#### Could I have been a sporting champion?

FACED WITH THE FORMIDABLE SUCCESS OF THE WILLIAMS SISTERS, RALPH JONES WONDERS WHETHER TALENT, LUCK OR PRACTICE WOULD HAVE TAKEN HIM TO THE TOP

'm not bad at playing soccer. In my more embarrassingly self-indulgent moments, when I fantasise about an alternative me, I tell people that if I had really tried, maybe I might have made it as a professional goal scorer. And, because we'll never know, I can't be wrong.

But just how much work actually goes into making an elite athlete? The Williams sisters. Venus and Serena, have dominated the tennis world for so long that it's easy to forget how phenomenal and, frankly, exhausting their story is: that if you apply the same relentless training to two children, they can both become the best in the world in a highly competitive sport.

That's the story of King Richard, in which Will Smith plays the girls' father, Richard Williams. Williams, who dreamed up a comprehensive plan for his daughters before they were even born, underlines the crucial role that parents play in moulding prodigies. "We were almost brainwashed to think we were going to be number one," Venus once said. But were the girls naturally destined to be great? Or could any parent raise world champions with a rigorous enough regime?

It's hard to discuss the making of a champion without addressing Malcolm Gladwell and the 10.000-hour rule. Often misunderstood, and synonymous with Gladwell rather than Herbert Simon and William Chase, the academics with whom it originates, the "rule" is that if you spend 10,000 hours practising a complex task and you already have an innate talent for it, you will become

a master. "In cognitively demanding fields, there are no naturals," wrote Gladwell, famously.

It's not that simple. of course. It's an area with no definite answers. But the point is that 10.000 hours is a lot of work. It's





almost 14 months. And this isn't enough in and of itself. You also need luck. And the most important luck of all? Being born good at something.

In sport, a 2014 meta-analysis found that practice accounted for only 18% of the difference between good and elite athletes. The authors decided that "deliberate practice is important, but not as important as has been argued". There are countless questions here. Do people practise more because they are more naturally talented? How early can "talent" be defined and separated from practice? But relentless practice can clearly take you to great places.

It's important to remember, for your self-esteem, that Serena Williams isn't as good at your job as you are. The gap between me and a professional soccer player is only enormous because at some point the professional could afford to keep practising 24/7 to the exclusion of everything else. Or, in other words, you're only not a champion because you chose not to be. You're welcome.

#### THE VERDICT

You're in luck: because both practice and genes play a significant role in becoming a champion, you can choose to blame whichever one suits you best.

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#### AUBREY PLA ZA ISN'T wHO YoU THINK SHE IS.

Case in point: the night before our interview about her new indie drama Spin Me Round, I conduct a quick survey. I open my phone, fire up WhatsApp and ask a few friends and colleagues how they imagine the sardonic star of shows like Parks and Recreation and Legion might have spent lockdown when the world ground to a halt in March 2020. "I can see her riding horses through abandoned shopping malls," came one reply. "Biweekly blood sacrifices," came another. "Seances! Definitely seances!" was another in a long list of wild suggestions. As it happens, there were indeed a few rituals attempting to commune with the dead in the Plaza household when Covid struck. "But, like, wearing sweatpants. I wasn't dressed in a big velvet robe or whatever," the 37-year-old clarifies between mouthfuls of salmon teriyaki take-out, sat cross-legged on the floor of her east Hollywood apartment. "I dabbled in witchcraft and got really into tarot cards, but I'm actually way more boring than people think. The horses thing sounds cool, though! I should look into that..."

There's good reason why people may struggle to picture Plaza spending quarantine baking banana bread and playing Animal Crossing like the rest of us. Plaza has an almost mythological status among fans as a cult agent of chaos, both onscreen and off - a glitch in the Hollywood matrix, bringing anarchy and awkwardness wherever she wanders. Over the last decade, the Delaware-born actor has inhabited some of the most memorably maniacal outsiders and weirdos that recent film and TV has had to offer. Since making her name as exasperated







Gothy teen April Ludgate in the hit mockumentary Parks and Recreation, she's played a social media stalker in indie drama Ingrid Goes West, an unhinged barista in Scott Pilgrim vs the World and a person possessed by a psychotic mutant in Marvel series Legion, to name just a few of her gloriously deranged performances. In each one, she's showcased deadpan delivery, sarcasm-laced smiles and the wide, threatening eyes of someone perched perilously close to the brink.

There's also the small matter of her appearances on talk shows and at awards ceremonies. One YouTube video - composed of footage of her pledging allegiance to the Devil on red carpets, regaling reporters with stories of sending her Parks and Rec peers vials of her blood and fingernails, and cackling her way through promotional interviews for a children's book she wrote dressed in full witch regalia - is fast approaching 20 million views. No wonder the world has come to think of the actor as a onewoman cyclone of eccentricity: this is a figure who frequently volunteers information like "my mother keeps all my baby teeth in her underwear drawer".

Recently, however, Plaza has realised that all that chaos was a protective barrier she placed around herself - a way of not letting her vulnerability show. "I'm way more sensitive than people realise. I'm a crab. Hard shell, but soft interior. It's all just me fronting when I'm really just a ball of mush deep down," she explains. During the stillness of the pandemic, when she was forced to take a break from her "workaholic" ways, she had an epiphany. "I realised the persona that I've created over the years was almost a coping mechanism for being a public figure," she sighs. "That persona came from my own insecurities and fears, and the impulse to give people what they want. People expect me to be weird, so it was easier to sort of disassociate and give them that."

The insecurities Plaza mentions took root early on in life. Born and raised in Delaware to a Puerto Rican father and Irish mother, she was "the only diverse kid in my high school" and found herself clowning around as something of a defence strategy, humiliating herself before others could humiliate her. "It's that instinct where you think, before I get attacked, I'm gonna attack first," she explains. Plaza soon found an outlet for her outsiderness in comedy, involving herself in improv and stand-up before joining the Chicago group Upright Citizens Brigade, whose other graduates

include The Office's Ellie Kemper and Plaza's Parks and Rec co-star Amy Poehler.

After a lengthy period waiting tables at bowling allevs and restaurants like Joe's Crab Shack (as glamorous as it sounds), Plaza was in New York auditioning for Saturday Night Live when opportunities began to snowball. In the space of one life-altering week, she was offered parts in Adam Sandler comedy Funny People, Parks and Rec and Scott Pilgrim. Her role as April Ludgate, which Parks and Rec creator Mike Schur wrote





especially for her after a casting director described her as "the weirdest girl I've ever met", catapulted Plaza to a type of fame that she wasn't sure how to handle – particularly when requests for her to appear on the likes of David Letterman and Jimmy Fallon's late night talk shows began to roll in.

"I was so shy as a child. I'm not comfortable in my own skin so being asked to just be myself on national television – that's scary to me," she says. "There's a level of feeling exposed that's terrifying. I'm a little better now, but I used to have this fear of people not liking me, so my instinct was always to divert this situation into something weird so people don't know what's happening and I can slink out the back door amid all the madness."

After Parks and Rec finished in 2015, Plaza was left at something of a crossroads. As co-star Chris Pratt moved into blockbusters, Plaza struggled to shake off her association with April Ludgate. She fielded offers to audition for a number of big Hollywood franchises, in which she was to play similarly sarcastic, eye-rolling millennials, but "blew the auditions" as she puts it. Looking back, she wonders if a part of her blew them on purpose. "My instincts are pretty strong and there are different parts that I really could have gone for, but for whatever reason, it wasn't to be. I think deep down if I know something is off, I'll sabotage it," she says.

Instead, Plaza has spent the past few years finding a niche in independent film that's been thrilling to follow. From sci-fi rom-com Safety Not Guaranteed and the brilliant social media drama Ingrid Goes West to 2020's deliciously twisty Black Bear, her filmography has had more room

for intimate, low-budget character studies of frayed, not-always-likeable women in the midst of maddening spirals. "I definitely gravitate towards darker things, which is not because I have an impulse to be dark," she says. "It's just that those roles tend to be more complicated and I love to sink my teeth into things that have many layers and complications."

Every character Plaza plays, including the one that goes on talk shows, is "some aspect of myself put on blast," she says. "But I don't feel like people really know who I am." That might be about to change in 2022. Having already made the transition from comedy co-star to enigmatic indie lead, Plaza's about to embark on a new chapter



in her career, taking on a succession of roles showcasing different, truer sides to her personality. In March, she'll appear in Spin Me Round, an intimate indie drama directed by her husband, Jeff Baena. Plaza plays a mysterious assistant to a restaurant chain CEO who invites a selection of employees to a remote retreat in Tuscany. From there, an Eyes Wide Shut-esque mystery begins to unfurl. "The energy of that shoot was insane, because everybody had been locked down. To go from that to being in Tuscany with so many hilarious, ridiculous people, it was a wild time. We all went to the beach together and were dunking each other in the ocean, thrashing around like children. It was next-level vibes," she recalls. "We worked hard and we played hard."

Also in the pipeline is Emily the Criminal, a dark thriller about a credit card scammer that won rave reviews at the Sundance Film Festival, Plaza calls it "the biggest departure from what people think they know about me. For a start, it's not funny. There are a couple of jokes, but it's really a drama at its core. It's really raw and Emily just feels like a

really different person to me." Elsewhere, there's a part opposite Jason Statham in new Guy Ritchie blockbuster Operation Fortune: Ruse de guerre, a turn with Michael Caine in book-tour buddy comedy-drama Best Sellers and a much-anticipated appearance in the second season of pitch-black TV comedy *The White Lotus*, which she's days away from jetting off to Italy to shoot when we talk. "It's scary to work on something where the first season was so fantastic and everybody loved it so much. There's a volcano in Sicily that erupts all the time. If that doesn't go off, and I don't f\*\*\* everything up, it should be alright."

Chaos doesn't actually follow her around the world. Despite the vials of blood and the amateur occultism. Aubrev Plaza does not descend on a feature film like a mystical curse. Rather, she raises up her characters with nuanced performances mixing the light with the shade and the real with the ridiculous. No, Aubrey Plaza isn't who you think she is, she's someone even more interesting.





# IT'S A SURPRISINGLY MILD WINTER'S DAY

when I meet the founders of Flock Together. Ollie Olanipekun and Nadeem Perera have captivated bird lovers across the world with their inclusive, community-focused enterprise, the first organisation to have opened up the world of birdwatching to people of colour. I'm joining them for a walk at one of London's most resplendent green spaces near Cockfosters (honest), just 40 minutes from the centre of London. A short walk from the station is Trent Country Park, where I'll hopefully be getting acquainted with a menagerie of birds. Ollie and Nadeem are a perfectly matched duo: Ollie buzzes with creative energy, while Nadeem is more laid-back with an almost encyclopaedic knowledge of birds.

Flock Together started during the pandemic. Nadeem commented on one of Ollie's Instagram posts, naming the birds he'd shared. That sparked a movement that's rapidly evolving into a global community, with groups already formed in the US, Japan and several other countries. "Your power is with your community," Ollie says. "Before, it'd be the brand or the institution that would dictate that power. Once you have the community, then you are the power. You are the entity."

Their job today is to demonstrate to me, a first-timer who's never even considered going on a walk before, that birdwatching is a rewarding pursuit. Luckily, we see our first high-flyer almost as soon as we step foot into the sprawling park. I trace the line of Nadeem's arm upwards to a circling kestrel – a bird of prey familiar to these parts and easily distinguished by its light brown plumage and dark spots. Easily distinguished by my guides, that is, who are completely immersed in and instinctively attuned to their surroundings.

This connection to the natural world is at the core of the Flock Together experience. Ollie and Nadeem want to introduce nature to those who have lost their relationship to it and to inspire young people from major cities. "When you say stuff like 'connect with nature' to a young 16-year-old black kid on an estate, they're gonna be like, 'What are you talking about?'" Ollie says.

"So I'm trying to help them understand what we mean with floaty statements

like that."



"It's about making them see value in it," Nadeem adds. "Everyone desires something positive. They just need to be shown it can be provided by this green space."

For both men, nature has been a healing source of escape. Leaving claustrophobic, traffic-choked streets behind to visit places where there is room to breathe, think and simply exist without an agenda has been life-changing for them and the growing number of Londoners who attend their monthly walks. As we stand next to a pond, where several mandarin ducks parade around in the water to catch our attention, Nadeem sums up the benefits: "When you're out in these expansive spaces with a community, your brothers and sisters - people who have similar stories to you - that feeling is one of a kind, there's nothing like it. What you've also got is a platform to discuss ideas and even just [some] therapy. Once you get to an environment that makes you happy, all of a sudden the whole world opens up and those buildings are no longer blocking your vision."

I can feel it too – only an hour ago I was in the dense centre of the UK capital. Now I'm surrounded >



Since Flock Together took their first walk the world's media have shown great interest. Their slot on the BBC's primetime The One Show brought them to the attention of a wider audience and they've been signed up to write a book. They also collaborate with brands, including Fila - Nadeem sports a pair of their collab kicks on the walk (though they end up covered in mud). Ollie is unashamedly vocal about their desire to work with more corporations and brands to facilitate their big

ideas. It's a way to launch more Flock Together wings and affect more lives in a positive way.

They're also highlighting how many everyday pursuits are still considered "unusual" for people who aren't white. Ollie and Nadeem bring up the negative online comments levelled at a group of Muslim hikers who posted photos of their walk in the Peak District last December. It's clear there is still a lot of work to be done, which makes platforms like Flock Together vital.

It's not just in the UK where ignorance needs to be combatted or green space deserves to be explored, of course. Flock Together is equally





important to New York City, where walks take place in Central Park, through woodlands re-established to encourage avian repopulation. Around 210 species can be spotted throughout the year – most commonly the brightly coloured northern cardinal and scarlet tanager, plus the American robin, blue jay, tufted titmouse and lots more. (Incidentally, it was in Central Park where black birdwatcher Christian Cooper was falsely accused of threatening a white dog walker, who called the police – on 25 May 2020, the same day George Floyd was murdered by police in Minneapolis.) On the West Coast, walks are being organised by the first chapters in Los Angeles.

"In segregated areas there's more of a need for safe spaces for people of colour," Ollie says. "That's why we're so keen

to move into the US, to bring marginalised people together and make sure that they feel safe."

The sky's the limit, and Nadeem and Ollie's excitement is infectious. "This year, the focus is not only to provide this safe space with the walks but to also create initiatives," Ollie tells me. "So it might be a film, it could be a supper club, it could be a camping trip. Platforms where we can share our ideas on a bigger scale."

As we walk through some denser woodland, the sun bursts from behind the clouds, dousing the trees in bright light. A jay with stunning blue plumage makes an appearance on a nearby branch, while I stand more completely still than I have for months – grounded to the spot and in the moment. Towards the end of the walk we hear the distinctive rat-a-tat drumming sound of a woodpecker high

above us. Soon, Nadeem's 20/20 vision has marked it out, and I too catch a split-second glimpse of the distinctive red flash under its polka dot tail as it zips over our heads. It's a totally exhilarating, even life-affirming experience.

The great spotted woodpecker is the bird that sparked Nadeem's curiosity as a teenager, and I'm also feeling the buzz. As I reach for my phone to grab a few photos I realise I've barely had it out the entire time we've been here. Talking, connecting, sharing moments of pure joy – that's what today's walk has been about. As we retrace our steps heading home, little tits dance around above us, the kestrel that welcomed us is hanging out at the same tree and birds jostle at a feeder outside the Trent Country Park cafe. All three of us feel invigorated and refreshed on the train back into the city. It's akin to having been at a holistic retreat.


There's another level to this deceptively simple idea, I realise. It's about respect. Respect for the planet. Respect for life. Respect for your own wellbeing. "Birding saved my life," Nadeem says emphatically. Now, with Ollie, he's trying to do the same for others.







IN 1999, ANOTHER Boiling Point - a fly-on-the-wall series - chronicled life behind the pass at a prestigious London restaurant. Documenting expletive-fuelled ego trips and aggression behaviour, it could have been the head chef's undoing; instead, it made Gordon Ramsay a household name.


Fast forward 20-odd years and the toxic stereotypes that programme legitimised chefs as bullying, egotistical men, restaurant kitchens as chaotic hellscapes - have shown up again in this award-winning feature film from director Philip Barantini. It is deftly written, superbly acted - Stephen Graham and Vinette Robinson are particularly arresting - and beautifully shot, in one continuous take in a real restaurant in east London. But how representative is it of kitchens today?

That depends on who you're asking. For every real-life chef who says it's an honest portrayal, there's one arguing it doesn't go far enough, and two - this seems the most popular take - arguing it's dated. The arrival (and, crucially, promotion) of women and minorities in professional kitchens means many are no longer the hotbeds of toxic masculinity they once were. And - as the film implicitly references - the rise of "open" kitchens means throwing curses, pots and insults around is not as easy to get away with as it was. In my book The Female Chef. I spoke to women all over Britain who want to put that way of working firmly behind us.

What Boiling Point captures brilliantly is the intensity of service on a Friday in December. Crescendoing relentlessly toward a volley of climaxes, it offers a small but authentic taste of the cocktail of emotions - fear, pride, pressure, dread, exhaustion, elation, anger kitchen and serving staff feel.

It is also a cautionary tale. This kind of conduct may be less common than it was, but the abuse of staff by some customers (racist, leery, self-important, they're all here) is as pertinent as it ever was. Either way, watch it and be grateful making food for a living is no longer the battle it once was. Meet Rising Star Izuka Hoyle on p11




