



NEVADA'S NEW GHOST TOWN

Nope, this isn't a very large, very grey mirage. You're looking at *City*, a megasculpture by American artist Michael Heizer. Work began on the site a few hours' drive north of Las Vegas 50 years ago and the \$40 million project is now finally open to the public. Visitors can wander the 2.5km-long structure which, according to Heizer, is all about our "awareness of and reflection upon the subjectivity of our human experience of time and space". Pretty concrete, then.

S

ome things in life are just meant to go together. Lennon and McCartney. Macaroni and cheese. Airports and flustered fathers who insist on turning up six hours before boarding

commences ("Just to be on the safe side!" as this writer's dad always put it). Other things that undeniably belong together on the inventory are Hollywood and music biopics. The list of musicians whose lives have been retold as blockbuster movies goes on longer than a Leonard Cohen track: Bob Dylan, NWA, Elton John and Freddie Mercury are just a few of them. And yet audiences are still yelling, "Encore!" The craving for films about rock and pop stars simply will not go away.

Elvis – screening on today's flight and starring Austin Butler as the troubled but talented King – is the latest example of the genre to leave audiences all shook up. Featuring Tom Hanks as the singer's controversial, Southern-accented manager, it's a splashy entry in the music biopic canon that's every bit as extravagant as you'd expect from director Baz Luhrmann, best known for William Shakespeare's Romeo + Juliet and Moulin Rouge! It's also the beginning of a new wave of music biopics crashing into cinemas soon.

Martin Scorsese's next movie tells the story of the Grateful Dead. Harry Potter himself, Daniel Radcliffe, made waves earlier this year when it was announced that he'll star in *Weird: The AI Yankovic Story*, about the comedian known for his parody pop songs. The production team responsible for *Mamma Mia!* is presently hard at work on a film about Cher, while Madonna's life story will soon be explored in a movie co-written by Madge herself. And that's not to mention JJ Abrams' upcoming Netflix series about the origins of U2.

What is it that keeps Hollywood cranking the volume up on music biopics? Rock stars historically live a lifestyle that us mere mortals rarely get to experience and often pull on past pain to create the music they've become famous for. Who doesn't love discovering the secret struggles behind songs we all know and love? There's something inherently cinematic about the stories of the musicians we worship as a culture. And awards season is frequently dominated by such movies: Walk the Line, Bohemian Rhapsody and Ray – about Johnny Cash, Freddie Mercury and Ray Charles respectively - are just a few music biopic Oscar winners from over the years. So it's no wonder Hollywood has them on repeat. Audiences, to paraphrase Mr Presley, can't help falling in love with music biopics. Until that changes, the song remains the same.

had just landed a part alongside him in one of the biggest movies of 2022, DC superhero spectacle *Black Adam.* "The role I play is very important," teases the 38-year-old, giving little away about the secretive character he's due to portray. "All I can say is that he's super key to Dwayne's character and the whole mythology of *Black Adam.*"

Those who've been following Latukefu's impressive ascent won't be surprised by the casting – nor Dwayne Johnson's fondness for him. In 2019, the Sydney-based actor rose above stiff competition to land the lead role in biopic series *Young Rock*, depicting the People's Champ's journey out of poverty and into American icon status. What's in store in the show's eagerly anticipated third season? And what does *Young Rock* mean for the next chapter of Latukefu's career? We'll let the man himself explain...

Like The Rock, you grew up in a single-parent home, moving houses often as your mother fought to keep her family above the breadline. Has it felt at times like you've been telling your own story in Young Rock, as well as Dwayne's?

Absolutely. It's been a little strange. I think his background is similar to a lot of people, which is why it's such a beautiful story to tell – it's inspirational and sends a message that you can do anything. Yes, it's a comedy, but also it's a guide to getting out of a rut in life, you know? There was a lot from my own life to draw from. I experienced poverty – I remember the hunger of being so desperate to put

food in my belly. I also got into trouble – the usual stuff that guys from that socioeconomic background get up to. And, like Dwayne, I had a sporting dream. I played rugby in my teens and was very serious about it, until a dislocated shoulder ended that dream.

What kind of pressure comes with portraying someone so famous and beloved?

The biggest pressure was the pressure I put on myself to do his story justice. It was the most anxious I've ever been, waiting for the show to come out – I was watching it as it aired like everyone else, praying, please don't be crap! I was really pleased with how it came out – so

many people have shared about how, for example, an episode in season one talking about depression meant a lot to them. Male depression wasn't a conversation in the 90s, especially for athletes, who were told to toughen up and move on. It means a lot to show the reality of that.

You're about to film season three, but also about to step up into big blockbuster filmmaking in *Black Adam* and with *Next Goal Wins*, the new film from Taika Waititi. What are your aspirations for this next stage in your career?

Well, we're about to shoot season three of *Young Rock* in Memphis, which I'm really excited for, telling the next phase in Dwayne's journey to who he is today. I'm not sure how long the show will go on for – there are so many lessons to be learned from his life that I hope we can continue telling this story. For me, I love making action comedies but I love any film where I can play different shades of someone. Martin Scorsese is the guy who lit a fuse in me in terms of my appreciation for filmmaking so he'd be a dream collaborator. If I learned one thing from *Young Rock*, it's that the sky's the limit.

enry Melich may have been one of the Caribbean's most important architects, but his life and work have barely been chronicled – until now. *Island Follies* is the first book

to document how Melich transformed the Bahamas in the 1960s and beyond – and found himself at the centre of a glamorous community of monied expats.


Alastair Gordon – who authored the book with wife Barbara de Vries – became fascinated by Melich when he first heard about him on a trip to the Bahamas. "I happened to meet [his daughter] Tanya Melich Crone," Gordon says. She told him how her Czech-born father escaped Nazi invasion and went on to study architecture in London, before settling in Nassau in the 1950s. "His career intrigued me, so I started to do my own research, working with the archives his daughter so lovingly preserved."

Gordon discovered that Melich was the go-to architect for the European socialites and minor royals who had begun to move to Nassau in the middle of the last century, including the Bacardi family and Greek shipping magnate George Livanos. The architect designed high-end homes for his clients, bringing a new form of









neoclassicism to the Bahamas, favouring tent-like interiors, faux ruins, neoclassical colonnades, fountains and garden pergolas.

But, however grandiose the designs, Gordon says Melich's work was always rooted in the spirit of the Bahamas. "[You can see this] through his use of Bahamian colours and the way he integrated tropical landscape elements with his buildings," says Gordon. "His work

was always whimsical and partially tongue in cheek."


Full steam to Yorkshire

ART FOR EVERYONE IN JOHANNESBURG

The creative scene in South Africa's capital has swapped pretension for accessibility, says **Lerato Mogoatlhe**



ohannesburg is one of South Africa's most significant cities. Its long history – as the site of the gold boom, as an anti-colonial battlefield, as the launchpad for world-altering political

movements – has inspired a lot of creativity and given rise to one of the world's most vibrant arts scenes. Until recently, Joburg's rarefied artistic institutions could feel intimidating to the average punter – but no more. These days, anyone and everyone can get involved, all thanks to a host of new, less formal galleries and institutions on a mission to democratise art.

Friday afternoon at the **Rooftop at Hallmark House**, downtown Johannesburg. This is the place to be. The slow trickle of patrons turns into a steady stream around 5pm, who come for vibey DJ sets and one of the best views in the city. The building was recently converted into a lifestyle complex where art takes centre stage: works by emerging South African artists stud the walls and a permanent exhibition of Nelson Makamo's portraits – adored by celeb patrons like Oprah Winfrey and Giorgio Armani – allows visitors an intimate encounter with his work. Also in the building: sleep at the **Hallmark House Hotel (1)**, work remotely at the mural-daubed cafe **Thorn**, and wine and dine at the **Marabi** jazz club.

Just a short walk away is the Maboneng Precinct, home to some of the city's best street art. **One Day Africa**'s walking tours offer the opportunity to explore the district through its murals and graffiti, and even meet some of the artists. While in Maboneng, check out the **Kwa Mai Mai** traditional market, which has become an unlikely party spot and a go-to for *braai* (meat that's cooked on an open fire).

For a more traditional art experience, visit the **Standard Bank Gallery**. It's one of the city's most important art spaces, with a collection of 1,000-plus

pieces that have been amassed over more than 40 years, including works by homegrown masters like Gerard Sekoto and Irma Stern.

Strauss & Co is another old-guard institution that's well worth a visit, where a blend of classic and contemporary works is spotlighted through ongoing exhibitions featuring South Africa's most prominent artists. Strauss & Co is in Houghton, where President Nelson Mandela used to live. His primary residence has been turned into a boutique hotel called Sanctuary Mandela. Here you'll find lots of intimate tributes to the beloved statesman, including photographs of his private and public life, plus wax-sealed menus at the restaurant inspired by his love of letter writing. The dishes are curated by his former personal chef of more than 20 years – try the prawn curry, one of Madiba's favourite dishes.

Next door in Rosebank, the **Keyes Art Mile**- which runs along Keyes Avenue - brings together
some stellar galleries and restaurants, all within a
short, walkable stretch. Start at **Everard Read**

- opened 109 years ago, it's Africa's oldest commercial gallery. Across the road you'll find the bijou **Circa** and **BKhz Studio (2)** - both excellent spaces which typically exhibit one artist at a time. Afterwards, head to **Momo Kuro (3)** for Asian fusion food and the most beautiful views of Rosebank at sunset. If you're keen to pick up a little something, try the **Rosebank Market**, a one-stop shop at the Rosebank Mall that sells art, curios and textiles from Central and West Africa.

These days, Rosebank's neighbour, Parktown North, has become one of Johannesburg's favourite places to eat and shop. But to art-loving locals, it is

first and foremost home to **Gallery MOMO (4)**.

Established in 2002 with the aim of showcasing contemporary art from South Africa, the continent and the diaspora, it's become a powerful

force on the city's art scene. Nearby

Stevenson is another agenda-setting
gallery – never one to play it safe, their
exhibitions display works from vanguard
artists like Zanele Muholi, Penny Siopis and
Robin Rhode, among others. The Melrose
Gallery (5) is the city's leading space for all
things sculptural and home to SculptX, South
Africa's largest sculpture fair.

Amateur collectors would do well to visit **Victoria Yards** – an industrial-complex-turned-commercial space in Lorentzville. Here you'll find the studios of local artists like Blessing Ngobeni, Hannelie

artists like Blessing Ngobeni, Hannelie Coetzee and Dario Manjate. Also in the Yards, **Cp Arts** offers two-hour pottery classes where students learn to make their own hearth-fired mug. If

you're in Johannesburg on the first Sunday of the month, check out Victoria Yard's First Sunday Market for food stalls, live music and handmade knickknacks. It's an arty party – and everyone's invited.

Do ghosts use phones?

IN NEW MOVIE THE BLACK PHONE, THE SPIRITS OF ABDUCTED CHILDREN WARN OTHERS OF THEIR FATE WITH A CALL, BUT COULD IT REALLY HAPPEN? ASKS SPOOKED RALPH JONES

A

t some point we've all wondered if ghosts can use phones. It's up there with the big questions of our age: how can we save the planet? What is the meaning of life? Who will become

our leader when Sir David Attenborough dies?

We're asking that particular question (the ghost one) because of *The Black Phone*, a film in which the spirits of children abducted by a man called The Grabber (played by Ethan Hawke) are able to communicate with other kids to help them avoid a similar fate. *The Black Phone*, it seems, is happy to postulate that if ghosts exist, they've got mobile data.

There may not be any scientific evidence to confirm the existence of ghosts but plenty of people – perhaps as many as 50% – believe

people – pernaps as many as 50% – that they're there. (Your Auntie Kay is one of them, isn't she?) What's more, the phenomenon of "phantom calls" or "ghost calls" is a very real thing in the world – there is lots of anecdotal data about people picking up the phone only to be met with eerie silence or dark murmurings from the other end. Could these calls be the communications of spirits from beyond

the grave?
Paranormal
investigators looking to
keep themselves in the
headlines will announce that
ghosts do in fact use phones
to communicate with the living
– often withholding their number,
the cheeky devils. This is what people
may be experiencing, for example, when they have

afterwards that the person on the other end had been dead for 50 years.

an innocent phone conversation only to find out

real for the people going through them. But why would a ghost use a phone? If they have enough of a physical form to dial a phone number, why not deliver the message in person? And why are the calls so often just grunts and growls, like the ramblings of a pervert?

No doubt these experiences are immensely

If ghosts were visitors from another realm, it feels silly to conclude that they would use phones, let alone use them so ineptly. Having

survived death, it seems safe to say they would be able to appear to those they wished to contact – like Patrick Swayze with his pottery wheel.

Science

comes down pretty hard on this one. Phantom calls often have a mundane explanation: they are the result of an autodialer that is calling phone numbers on an endless cycle. Even ssuming ghosts do exist

assuming ghosts do exist, the likelihood they would play prank calls seems pretty low. We have to think more highly of our spooky friends than this.

When you pick up the phone and hear a muttering on the other end of the line, chances are it's not the ghost of a weirdo – it's just a weirdo.















Christina Ricci wants to talk over the phone. Not a Zoom or a FaceTime - the new normal for celebrity interviews thanks to the pandemic - but a good, old-fashioned telephone call. For anyone else I may not have acquiesced so easily - seeing a Hollywood star in their own surroundings and being able to make eye contact obviously helps build a rapport but for an icon of the 1990s like Ricci? A phone call feels almost appropriate.

I can't see her facial expressions. I don't know when she's smiling. And when she laughs, I can't tell whether she's laughing with me or at me. It's ambiguous. Exactly like Ricci - who dominated the 1990s with her jet-black hair, five-foot frame and cool irreverence.

Having shot to fame aged 11 after a breakout performance as morbidly precocious Wednesday in *The Addams Family* (1991), Ricci's penchant for offbeat, twisted characters carried her from bankable child star (*Casper* in 1995) to teen goth icon (Tim Burton's Sleepy Hollow in 1999) and beyond (Monster in 2003). Basically, if it was a bit dark, it had Ricci's name all over it.

Cut to 2022 and along with a wealth of other 1990s gems (see: low-rise pants, Sex and the City and Britney) Ricci, now 42, is back in vogue. It's all thanks to an Emmy-nominated performance in cult US horror drama series Yellowjackets, a string of chilling indie roles - like in this year's Monstrous and a closely guarded appearance in Tim Burton's forthcoming Netflix comedy horror, Wednesday, based on Ricci's character in The Addams Family. Remember the McConaissance of the 2010s? Welcome to the Riccaissance.



Ricci surpasses herself in *Yellowjackets*. The show follows a group of teenagers in the 1990s who, following a plane crash, resort to cannibalism to survive in the wilderness, and her portrayal of the group's unlikely ring leader – sociopathic outsider Misty Quigley – 25 years later, is so disturbing *New York* magazine called her "the most terrifying character on TV".

Ricci might be the only person who doesn't find her terrifying. "That's not the kind of actor I am," she explains from her home in Los Angeles. "The things I exploit to play the character are not the more terrifying elements. What's terrifying about her is not that she has sinister pursuits or morbid fascinations, it's that she has crossed every line. She is terrifying because she has no normal boundaries, none of the moral constraints the rest of us live by. So when you're playing a person who has absolutely no constraints, it's actually exhilarating and exciting."

In other words, what ultimately appealed to Ricci about *Yellowjackets* – which she is currently filming season two of alongside co-stars Juliette Lewis and Melanie Lynskey – is a lot more nuanced than merely seeking out dark material. "I've always been fascinated by people whose pettiness is so exaggerated that it's dangerous. What's happened to that person to make them feel that small?" she ponders. "Misty isn't a stereotype, she's a real human being."

The through line in all Ricci's characters, she points out, is less about being evil and more about being different. "I don't want to play something I've seen before. That is what I'm always looking for," she says. "I don't need them to be bad people or do nefarious things, but usually the more interesting, different, complicated characters do end up being the ones that do questionable things."

Misty has come as a "wonderful surprise" to Ricci, who has waited long enough for a role to really sink her teeth into in recent years. Although she has worked consistently and her CV now spans an astonishing four decades, this new chapter definitely feels like a welcome return to the glory – or should that be gory – years we all know and love. The rom com-fuelled 2000s were, for example, a particular struggle for an actress emblematic of the grunge era.

"I had people guiding my career who were definitely wanting me to be more commercial and that was a mistake, for sure," says Ricci, WEDNESDAY'S CHILD

Anjelica Huston was nominated for a Golden Globe for her performance as matriarch Morticia Addams, but it was the sometimes silly, always sadistic antics of Ricci's Wednesday (above) that stole the show. The film was followed by a sequel. Addams Family Values. in 1993.

The Ice Storm (1997)

Ricci made the (not always so) seamless transition from child star to serious contender in Ang Lee's, erm, icy adaptation of Rick Moody's 1994 novel. Set in the 1970s, the action follows the entanglement of two families over one tumultuous Thanksgiving holiday with Ricci cast as darkly provocative teen daughter Wendy.

Yellowjackets

When their plane crashes in the middle of nowhere. a team of high school soccer players is forced to do whatever it takes to survive in the Canadian wilderness for 19 months. The main action is set in the 1990s. A cast of 1990s legends (Ricci! Lewis! Lynskey!) plays the girls 25 years on. Terrifyingly nostalgic.

sighing. "I could have been doing really interesting things even if they weren't mainstream. I think - as most people have learned by now - if there isn't a place for you as an artist, you can create your own place. And I should have been more focused on that instead of trying to put a square peg in a round hole."

The turning point came when she "started concentrating on doing the things that played to my strengths". And what would Ricci define those as? What is her superpower? "I don't think I have a superpower at all but I have been through quite a bit in my life. I've always had one foot in between this Hollywood world and real life.

"I have been through very much in my life, starting from childhood, and I think it allows me to not immediately bump up against new ideas or concepts that seem shocking to other people. I don't have that, 'Oh my God, what a crazy person,' reaction, so I am able to play a character without judgement. That is maybe what makes me different."

Ricci's childhood is well documented. Having made her film debut opposite Cher and Winona Ryder in cult 1990 movie Mermaids (after being

spotted in a school production aged eight), Ricci had a turbulent relationship with her father and suffered from an eating disorder when she was 14.

"I had a very bad home life and any time I went to work that was an escape, so I was very eager to keep that going," she recalls. "I really liked [performing] and being told I was good at something, and I liked achieving, but really acting was a refuge."

As such, it's hard to tell whether starring in The Addams Family at such a young age is what gave her a taste for the unconventional. "Was I more inclined to do things that were a little bit off centre at that age or was it being so rewarded and applauded for being that character at that early age that made me that way?" she ponders. "I'm not really sure."

Either way, she is proud of the direction the supernatural comedy film took her career in and was "dying" to work with Tim Burton again on his new project for Netflix. Along with the identity of Ricci's character, much is still under wraps about the fantasy-horror-mystery-comedy when we speak, but it has been described as a coming-ofage series that follows Wednesday (played by

Jenna Ortega) as a teenager at Nevermore Academy.

To Ricci, Wednesday is ultimately a role model, worthy of such celebration. "The amount of memories women have of being little girls and having to say or do things that we just didn't want to do and hating every second of it..." she recalls with, I imagine, a shudder. "Wednesday never demeans herself by doing what other people expect of her. There's a strength, self respect and dignity in that, that a lot of us weren't allowed as children. That is something to be emulated."

As a teenager living in 1990s New York, Ricci was predictably subversive herself; a "feral creature" who lived in men's underwear, dressed up in slip dresses and platforms from Screaming Mimis Vintage, and snuck into nightclubs she wasn't allowed into. "I was a wild teenager," she admits, "but I believe that certain people need to be so they're not wild adults."

Indeed, it's a far cry from the sheltered life she lives today in the affluent suburb of Woodland Hills with her husband, hairstylist Mark Hampton, their nine-monthold daughter, Cleo, and her eight-year-old son, Freddie, from a previous marriage.

And while her head may be filled with memories of a life less ordinary, Ricci isn't nostalgic enough to have kept anything physical from back in the day. Something Hampton, who has been collecting his wife's old magazine covers from eBay, "finds horrifying".

"I don't have pictures of myself from when I was a teenager and I never wrote in a journal. I don't have keepsakes, I have memories," she says. "I think it's probably not entirely healthy but it's probably a coping mechanism from a very chaotic childhood and life. When friends are like, 'You don't have



pictures or photo collages?' I'm like, 'Listen, man, I don't know how your life has been, but when you're on the ground, dealing with stuff and trying to make things work, who has time?'"





What does it feel like to wear the buttoned suit? Initially, it felt quite weird. But I'd grown up seeing my dad as a Pearly King and it's almost like a cockney character that he plays when he slips the suit on, having a dance and putting a smile on people's faces, so it soon came naturally.

What's special about your borough of Wembley? Wembley Stadium is a big deal for football fans, so

I love that aspect. Plus, there are lots of buildings going up, so it feels like a really up-and-coming area.

Nowadays, it's a really inspiring and creative place, with urban food markets, street artists and the pop-up BOXPARK shopping area.

The Pearly tradition was born out of east London's street market culture in the 1870s, where traders used cockney rhyming slang as a secret language and embellished their clothing with pearls to attract the eye of potential customers.

The first Pearly
monarch – Henry Croft, a
road-sweeping orphan
with a flair for street
theatre – was inspired to
decorate his own suit in a
riot of mother-of-pearl
buttons, and would wear it
to collect pennies for poor
children and hospitals.

The Pearly suits can be covered in nearly 30,000 buttons, weighing as much as a 10-year-old child.
To see a Pearly suit up close, head to the Museum of London near Barbican, where an ensemble once

worn by the Pearly King of

Islington is displayed.

While traditionally
Pearly titles are passed
down through families, the
rules have loosened in
recent years to allow those
with a genuine passion to
apply for membership.
The major event in
every Pearly diary is the
annual harvest festival,

held at St Mary-le-Bow and





Born in Bełchatów, Poland, in 1925, Herschel "Harry" Haft (played by Ben Foster, above) was just 15 when he was captured during World War II and sent to the first of six concentration camps he'd ultimately survive.

How on earth did he make it?

Boxing. An overseer at the Jaworzno camp noted Haft's impressive physique and offered him the chance to fight fellow inmates, effectively to the death, for the amusement of SS officers.

That's horrific.

Yes, Haft reportedly beat 76 opponents, before escaping in the confusion of a major Red Army advance in 1945.

Did he have a happy ending?

Kinda. He was taken in by the Americans and won boxing trophies in post-war Munich, later emigrating to the US where his glittering career was brought to an end by heavyweight legend Rocky Marciano in 1949. Haft married and had three kids, the oldest of whom wrote the book upon which this morally ambiguous movie is based.







before leaving for New York to make a name for
herself as a racy cabaret chanteuse.

Everett's journey – Manhattan to Manhattan, via Manhattan – has a pleasing symmetry. But how much of the show is based on her actual life? Plenty, actually. Born the youngest of six, **Everett's oldest sister Brinton** passed away from cancer in 2008. Everett, like Sam on the show, had long nurtured a love of music and showbiz, after growing up with an alcoholic music teacher mum. Combine that with the kind of caustic wit that's essential when growing up as the runt of the litter and you have yourself an act.

Still, just like her character
Sam, Everett was something of a
late bloomer. Thanks to her
respectable mezzo-soprano voice
she bagged a place studying music
in Arizona, where she was also on
the swim team – Sam swims on the
show. Aged 26, she moved to
New York, where a housemate
took her to a cabaret bar. Before
long Everett had cultivated a
wild act, belting Janis Joplin's
Piece of My Heart alongside her
own compositions, which
featured upbeat ditties about
her breasts and sexuality.

Touring with Amy Schumer, and a couple of movies – including a cameo on Sex and the City – finally helped her quit waitressing after 25 long years and make Somebody Somewhere, a show about finding your people and your voice, however long it takes.






